### GOVERNMENT OF CANADA CALLS FOR PROPOSALS AND FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES:

#### New funding opportunities

[Clean Energy for Rural and Remote Communities Program](#): The Clean Energy for Rural and Remote Communities (CERRC) program provides funding for renewable energy and capacity building projects to reduce the reliance on fossil fuels for heating and electricity in Indigenous, rural and remote communities across Canada. In support of the clean energy transition, the program's objective is to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and fossil fuel use by increasing the use of local renewable energy sources and related energy efficiency measures.

[Grants and Contributions Program to Voluntary Organizations](#): This funding supports eligible groups active in the area of corrections, conditional release and community reintegration. Stream 2 of the funding provides \$1.8 million in ongoing funding towards core expenditures for corrections and community reintegration programming.

- **Amount:** \$500,000 per fiscal year.

This program supports activities in 3 broad areas: creating provides support for research and the production and creation of new works of art; knowing provides support for the retention, maintenance, innovation and transmittal of cultural knowledge and creative practice. This includes contemporary and historical critical discourse, arts/cultural training and initiatives that seek to pass cultural knowledge to younger generations through artistic practice, and the renewal and maintenance of customary art practices; and sharing provides support for the dissemination, exhibition, presentation and distribution of works of art by First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples, which enrich and engage communities in Canada and abroad.

#### [Creating, Knowing, and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples – Long Term Projects](#)

[Creating, Knowing, and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit, and Métis Peoples – Long Term Projects](#): This program funds First Nations, Inuit and Métis professional artists, cultural carriers, arts and cultural professionals, groups, collectives and organizations. The program supports activities in 3 broad areas: creating provides support for research and the production and creation of new works of art; knowing provides support for the retention, maintenance, innovation and transmittal of cultural knowledge and creative practice. This includes contemporary and historical critical discourse, arts/cultural training and initiatives that seek to pass cultural knowledge to younger generations through artistic practice, and the renewal and maintenance of customary art practices; and sharing provides support for the dissemination, exhibition, presentation and distribution of works of art by First Nations, Inuit and Métis peoples, which enrich and engage communities in Canada and abroad.

#### **ARTS, CULTURE, AND LANGUAGE**

[Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program - Legacy Fund Stream](#): This funding stream provides funding for community – initiative capital projects, intended for community use.

- **Application Deadline:** Projects must be submitted before the anniversary date of the event or personality to be commemorated.
- **Amount:** Recipients may receive up to 50 per cent of eligible project expenses up to a maximum of \$500,000.
- **Region:** Across Canada.

[Building Communities Through Arts and Heritage Program – Local Festivals](#): This funding stream provides funding to local groups for recurring festivals that present the work of local artists, artisans, or heritage performers. This includes the celebration of LGBTQ2+ communities and Indigenous cultural celebrations.

- **Application Deadline:** January 31 – for festivals starting between September 1 and December 31 of the same calendar year; April 30 – for festivals starting between January 1 and June 30 of the next calendar year; and October 15 – for festivals starting between July 1 and August 31 of the next calendar year.
- **Amount:** Applicants may request up to 100 per cent of eligible expenses up to a maximum of \$200,000.

## [Canada Arts Presentation Fund – Professional Arts Festivals and Performing Arts Series](#)

**Presenters:** This funding stream supports existing professional arts festivals and performing arts series presenters to offer activities that connect artists with their Canadian communities.

- **Application Deadline:** April 1st and October 15th for projects which will occur after April 1st of the following year (April 1st is the application deadline for projects starting between April 1st and June 30th of the following year).
- **Amount:** For Professional Arts Festivals, we can fund up to 25% of eligible expenses or a maximum of \$100,000 per fiscal year in the case of grants and 25% of eligible expenses or \$500,000 per year in the case of contributions.

[Canada Cultural Spaces Fund:](#) This fund supports the improvement of physical conditions for arts, heritage culture and creative innovation. The fund supports renovation and construction projects, the acquisition of specialized equipment and feasibility studies related to cultural spaces.

[Peoples - Indigenous Organizations:](#) The Indigenous Organizations component of *Creating, Knowing and Sharing* funds First Nations, Inuit and Métis organizations that engage in contemporary, customary or traditional artistic and cultural activities. These activities can include non-Indigenous artists and collaborations with non-Indigenous organizations. Grants support the exploration of innovative strategies for Indigenous creative and cultural expression, and related administrative activities.

## [Creating, Knowing and Sharing: The Arts and Cultures of First Nations, Inuit and Métis Peoples – Small Scale Activities](#)

[Peoples – Small Scale Activities:](#) Funds activities that will advance your artistic career or practice. This may include acquiring materials for artistic production, engaging in career or artistic development activities or benefitting from specific expertise, advice or training from a professional artist or cultural carrier. First Nations, Inuit and Métis individuals, artistic groups, collectives and organizations working in all disciplines can apply.

It provides funding for community-based projects that help workers develop the skills they need to transition to new jobs. Who can apply: Not-for-profit organizations, for-profit organizations, municipal governments, Indigenous organizations or governments, and educational institutions.

[\*\*Emergency Management Assistance Program:\*\*](#) In partnership with First Nations communities, provincial and territorial governments and non-government organizations, this program helps communities on reserve access emergency assistance services. EMAP provides funding to First Nations communities so they can build resiliency, prepare for natural hazards and respond to them using the 4 pillars of emergency management.

[\*\*Emergency Management FireSmart program:\*\*](#) EMAP supports wildland fire non-structural mitigation and preparedness initiatives through the **FireSmart funding stream**. FireSmart builds skills in First Nations communities to prevent and prepare against wildland fires. Programming involves training First Nations teams in wildfire suppression duties, as well as fuel management and vegetation clearing, which reduces the intensity and spread of wildfires.

[\*\*Aboriginal Community Safety Planning Initiative:\*\*](#) This initiative works to prevent incidents of Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls, provides to enhance accessibility to Restorative Justice Programming, and responds to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission.

[\*\*Canada Community Security Program \(CCSP\):\*\*](#) Public Safety Canada (PS) is working to build a safe and resilient Canada and has a renewed commitment to this goal through the Canada Community Security Program (CCSP). The CCSP provides time-limited funding and support for communities at risk of [hate-motivated incidents and hate-motivated crimes](#) to enhance physical security at their gathering spaces.

## GENDER-BASED VIOLENCE

PrairiesCan will invest \$9.6M in projects such as designing and upscaling of modular homes, the use of 3D printing, mass timber construction, panelized construction, as well as implementing net-zero and climate resilient housing practices.
