### WHERE WE WORK



The past year marked the successful completion of CESO's five-year Volunteer Cooperation Program (VCP) STRIVE (Strengthening capacity and Innovation through Volunteer Expertise), funded by Global Affairs Canada. We are proud that our work, in partnership with our local clients, resulted in almost 2,000 initiatives promoting economic prosperity through strengthening small and medium-sized businesses and improving governance structures. All of this work was done with a lens to strengthening gender equity, women's economic empowerment and environmental sustainability.

Through our new VCP AWE (Accelerating Women's Empowerment) program we are expanding our work to 21 countries over seven years, effectively doubling the size of our program. This is a testament to our funder's confidence in CESO's strong track record of effective program management and delivering solid results for our developing country partners.

This year, more than ever, strong connections and reciprocal learnings were made between our Indigenous and International programs, specifically between our MERIT (Mongolia: Enhancing Resource Management through Institutional Transformation) project in Mongolia and our work with Indigenous clients in Canada. Both face serious challenges in managing their natural resources. The goal of our work in this area is to strengthen the effectiveness of managing the extractive sector to drive sustainable and inclusive economic growth, build capacity, create jobs and reduce poverty.

COVID-19 brought unique challenges and prevented our CESO Advisors from working in person with our clients. However, the need for our work didn't diminish. Our clients told us of the urgency they felt to improve organizational agility and economic resilience to help withstand and ultimately recover from the social and economic disruption caused by the pandemic. We took this as a challenge to innovate and to continue our work through virtual assignments. We thank our clients for their flexibility and are very pleased with the quality of work that has been achieved.

We could not have realized these achievements without the hard work, support and dedication of our partners, Advisors, staff and supporters. Together, we will emerge with a stronger commitment to an inclusive and prosperous world.





### **Toward Economic Prosperity**

This past year marked the completion of our **STRIVE** (Strengthening capacity and Innovation through Volunteer Expertise) five-year Volunteer Cooperation Program. Since 2015, we've empowered 690 unique organizations across 17 countries to promote sustainable economic development. Our partnerships delivered 1,863 assignments that build knowledge and skills to achieve greater economic and social well-being and equitable environments where businesses and communities can thrive.

In alignment with the **Feminist International Assistance Policy (FIAP)**, our interventions empowered women-led businesses and organizations that advance women's rights and gender equality.

Through **386** assignments across Asia, Latin America, the Caribbean and Africa, we helped build the skills and capacity of **6,235** people to deliver sustainable development results in response to local needs. CESO's activities were geared towards inclusive private sector development in industries such as tourism and hospitality, agribusiness and microfinance.

#### Examples of what our efforts accomplished:



With operational and marketing support, the Santos Women Weavers Association in the Philippines engaged new clients, boosted their sales and expanded by 22 members. Some members' monthly wages rose by 150%.



In Honduras, CESO's partnership with the Bay Islands Tourism Bureau in Roatan led to a new landfill strategy, a ban on single-use plastics and the creation of a composting and recycling program.



CESO and the Centre national d'Assistance et de Formation pour les Femmes (CENAF) in Senegal provided leadership training to 25 women. Equipped with the confidence to create social change, these women look forward to pursuing candidacy in upcoming municipal elections.



In Ethiopia, Zemen Tefera was supported to strengthen her leather goods manufacturing business, Amour Leather. She established a presence in export markets in North America, tripled her revenues and provided secure employment to 12 more women.

# Fostering Economic Opportunity in Canada's Indigenous Communities

Over the past year, CESO's advisory services, mentorships and workshops helped support Indigenous communities, small and medium-sized enterprises and entrepreneurs to strengthen capacity in planning, operations, management and governance.

Eighty active assignments took place in 2019-2020, with the majority of new assignments concentrated in the Northern, Atlantic and Quebec regions.

CESO's work has often included a remote component, such as e-mentoring. Positioned well for the virtual delivery of assignments, CESO is equipped to support organizations to pivot and embrace success in a post-COVID-19 environment.

### E-Mentoring for Economic Growth

Due to COVID-19, Marissa Mercurio—Economic Development Officer for Kugluktuk, Nunavut—received online mentorship support from her CESO Advisor, Kathy. After the experience, Marissa wrote successful grant proposals that led to funding for culture and heritage programs in her community. She also wrote a proposal for federal funding for food security related to the COVID-19 pandemic.



### Promoting Sustainable Economic and Social Development Through Responsible Resource Management in Mongolia

The MERIT project supports responsible resource management focused on sustainable economic and social development in Mongolia. MERIT works in partnership with leaders at multiple levels of government, communities and the private sector to build local capacity for collaboration and improve gender equality.

Over the past year, 54 assignments were delivered across Mongolia. Through the MERIT project, 2,822 public servants and community members were mentored, trained and reached. Of these beneficiaries, 57% were women.

From a gender audit at the Ministry of Mines and Heavy Industry to the piloting of Small and Medium Enterprise training, MERIT serves to improve the livelihoods of individuals in communities throughout Mongolia.



CESO's good financial standing positions us to meet our strategic objectives to expand our programs and services, deliver client service excellence and build our global profile. We will continue to ensure funds are used with great discretion to deliver services and programs that build a more inclusive and sustainable world.




